Class 7c1 (c1236-1240)

Diagnostic features of class 7c1

The chinless bust continues.

A small, rather untidy, beard beside each cheek.

The same round eyes continue on from class 7b4.

This class is recorded at Bury for the moneyers SIMVND & IOAN only

This class is recorded at Bury for the moneyers brive vivib & 10/Arv only

Typical readings and styles of lettering and the initial cross seen in 7c1

Obverse **henridus riax**

Reverse *SIHVND ON SAN & *IOHAN ON SAN

Class 7c2 (c1240-1242)

<u>Diagnostic features of class 7c2</u>

Again a chinless bust with an untidy beard. Tall lettering remains as do the letter shapes found in the preceding class.

Pellets in the curls and the legend are more often encountered.

Annulet eyes continue.

Occasional pellet on the chin.

As in 7c1 the chevron barred letter (A) " $\mathbf{\Lambda}$ " is occasionally encountered rather than the square shaped letter " $\mathbf{\Lambda}$ ".

Class 7c3 (c1242)

Diagnostic features of class 7c3

The larger lettering continues.

The bust is set higher up than the latter 4 classes.

This class has a distinct appearance from the earlier issues. Perhaps the thick luxurious beard, being the most diagnostic feature.

This class is recorded at Bury for the moneyer IOAN only.

Obverse **hankiavsk**† **ex** Reverse **FIOHAN ON SAN**

Typical readings and styles of lettering and the initial cross seen in 7c3

Pictures & die charts for 7c1 (c1236-1242)

Ligated lettering underlined. Dies not recorded by Eaglen in Red

The die <u>numbering</u> on the chart below is the same as that used in Dr. Eaglen's publication¹ on the Bury mint, this enables any die pair to be referred back to his catalogue i.e. (Eaglen 98). Alterations and additions since his publication have required that the die lettering i.e. (A-a1) be, in part, altered, meaning this reference <u>cannot</u> be relied on when referring back to his publication. The number in brackets on the joining line indicates the number of coins that are currently recorded from these dies.
